This Indenture, Made this 9th day of May A. D. 1907 between Adrian Houck

nesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one and no/100 dollars,
in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit-claimed, and by these
presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, h. s. heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim
and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the Creek water
Indian Territory, Western District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

Lot four (4) in Block Street in Grand
new addition to the town of Tulsa Indian
Territory

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, inter-
est and claim whatever of the said parties of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part,
h. s. heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, Olive G. Houck
wife of the said Adrian Houck
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said F. M. Wilder
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
