part, and Ethel Davis of Tulsa, Ind. Ter. party of the second part, wit-  
nesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty-Seven  
dollars, in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit-claimed, and by these  
presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim  
and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the Creek Nation  
Indian Territory, Western Judicial District, and known and described as follows, to wit:

The South West quarter of South West Quarter of Section  
nine (9) Township Eighteen (18) North Range Twelve (12) East,  
containing 40 acres more or less and being the Home-  
stead allotment of Friday Fulton Deceased.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, inter-  
est and claim whatever of the said part, of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part,  
his heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, Watashe husband of the said Rosa Watashe Heir of  
Friday Fulton Deceased

for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said

Ethel Davis all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
