

QUIT CLAIM DEED.

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

This Indenture, Made this Third day of June A. D. 1907 between Clinton L. Goodale and Ida Mae Goodale his wife of Collinsville Indian Territory, Western District, part of the first part, and E. A. Lee, J. H. Middleton, and J. R. Caselle of Collinsville Indian Territory, Western District, part of the second part, witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of _____ dollars, in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit-claimed, and by these presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in Collinsville Indian Territory, Western District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

all of Lot number nine (9) in Block number fifty eight (58) in the town of Collinsville Indian Territory according to the United States Government (that is) a survey of said town

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatever of the said party of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part, heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, Ida Mae Goodale

 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said parties of the second part
all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
