That this Court has full and complete jurisdiction of theparties and of the subject matter hereof by virtue of Section 9 of the Act of Congress entitled "An Act for the Removal of Restrictions from part of the lands of the allottees of the Five Civilized Tribes, and for other purposes", approved May 27, 1908; that the said lands covered by the said lease are located within the limits of Tulsa County, Oklahoma; that the bonus for said lease paid by the said Texas-Oklahoma Investment Company, to-wit: \$80.00/ is adequate.

It is therefore ordered that the said lease be and the same is hereby in all things full Iy confirmed and approved.
