CERTIFIED COPY OF ORDER. PROBATE NO. 529.

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF TULSA COUNTY, OKLAHOMA.

IN THE MATTER OF THE ALIENATION OF THE HOMESTEAD ALLOTMENT OF SUNDAY GRAYSON, DECEASED.

O R D E R.

Now, on this the 27th, day of February, 1909, this matter came on for hearing, upon the petition of Jennie Grayson, as an heir at law of Sunday Grayson, deceased, praying for an order of this court approving a certain deed of conveyance be her executed, conveying all her right, title and interest in and to the allotment of Sunday Grayson, deceased. The said petitioner appearing in person and by her attorneys, Abbott & Brown, and the court having heard the evidence of the petitioner and other testimony and being fully advised in the premises, finds:

That the allegations in the petition contained are true, and that the petitioner, Jennie Grayson, is a full-blood Creek Indian, duly enrolled as such; that the Sunday Grayson was a full-blood Creek Indian, duly enrolled as such, and that there was allotted to him with other lands, as his distributive share of the lands of the Creek Nation, the following described land, situate in Tulsa, County, Oklahoma, to-wit:

The Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section Four (4), Township Nineteen (19) North, Range Thirteen (13) East.

That the said Sunday Grayson, deceased, died on or about the ---day of May, 1904, in what is now Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, and was at the time of his death a resident of that portion of the Creek Nation of the Indian Territory embraced in what is now Tulsa County, Oklahoma; that the said Sunday Grayson, deceased, died leaving surviving him, as his only heirs at law, this petitioner, Jennie Grayson, his sister, Susie Harjo, his sister, Wattie Grayson, a brother, Buck Grayson/ a brother and Dick Grayson a brother, and that the said Sunday Grayson, deceased, had no children born to him after the 4th, day of March 1906.

The Court further finds that on the 27th, day of February, 1909, the petitioner, Jennie Grayson, made, executed and delivered a deed of conveyance to one R. A. Josey, thereby conveying all her undivided right, title and interest in and to the land described above, in consideration of the sum in said deed expressed, which said consideration the court finds is adequate, and which deed has been exhibited to the court.

IT IS THEREFORE, by the Court considered, ordered and adjudged and decreed that the said deed, above described, be and the same is hereby approved, according to section 9 of an Act of Congress, approved May 27, 1908, entitled "An Act for the removal of restrictions from a part of the lands of the Five Civilized Tribes; and for other purposes".
