ORDER CONFIRMING SALE.

A hearing was had in the above entitled cause on the 25th, day of November, 1908, said date being a regular Court day of November 1908 term of the County Court in and for Rogers County, Oklahoma, on the return of sale of oil and gas mining lease made by F. M. Bussey, Guardian of Earl W. Bussey, minor, to the Henry Oil Company, said Guardian being represented by his attorney Haskell B. Talley, and the Henry Oil Company being represented by its agent J. H. Middleton and it appearing to the Court that proper notices as provided by law had been given of the time, place and object of said proceedings, and Charles Francis appearing at the time fixed in the notice for the confirmation of the said sale to oppose the confirmation thereof and it further appearing to the Court that the appraisal of said oil and gas mining rights posting of notice of sale, waiver by the next of kin of notice and other proceedings had herein were regular and in conformity to the law, and the Court being fully advised in the premises finds, after a full examination of the records and returns herein and of all evidence submitted in support thereof, finds:

That in pursuance of said order of sale, said F. M. Bussey, as Guardian of Earl W. Bussey minor, on the 14th, day of November, 1908 sold an oil and gas mining lease on said estate described as follows:

The NE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 9, Township 21 North, Range 14 East, and NE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 4, Township 21 North, Range 14 East, at public vendue to the Henry Oil Company on the following terms, to-wit: For the sum of Eighty & 00/100 (\$80.00) Dollars, cash, and all costs of sale, and royalty of 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of all crude oil marketed from said premises, and Two Hundred Dollars per annum for each gas well, provided no rental to be paid while gas well is capped or closed/

That on the 25th, day of November, 1908, at Collinsville, Oklahoma, said time and place having been duly fixed by order of this Court, and notice having been posted as required by law, the return of sale of said oil and gas mining lease by the said Guardian came on to be heard, said guardian being present in person and by his attorney H. B. Talley, said The Henry Oil Company being represented by its agent J. H. Middleton in person, and said Charles Francis being present in person.

That said Charles Francis made a cash bid as bonus for the lease of the aforesaid land of \$200.00, said sum being ten per cent above the original bid therefor, made by the Henry Oil Company, exclusive of the expense of a new sale, and that the Henry Oil Company thereupon bid for and oil and gas mining lease upon said premises a bonus of \$201.00, and that the said Charles Francis Refused to bid as a bonus for an oil and gas mining lease upon said premises a sum greater than \$200.00,, and the Henry Oil Company was thereupon declared to be the successful
