

## ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF LIEN.

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of the Act of Congress approved March 2, 1907 (Public No. 180) for the relief of certain white persons who intermarried with Cherokee Citizens, and the Rules and Regulations to carry into effect the provisions of the same as approved by the Secretary of the Interior April 3, 1907, said persons are authorized to sell their improvements on the public domain of the Cherokee Nation at the valuation fixed by the Official Designated by the Secretary of the Interior to the allottee thereof within sixty (60) days after notice of such selection or be deemed to have forever abandoned and relinquished their rights to dispose of the same; ~~and~~,<sup>and</sup>

WHEREAS Dora E. Rogers, an intermarried white person had certain valuable improvements on the land allotted by Fixing Davis (W2 SE4 Sec. 26, T. 22 N., R 13 E.) which were appraised under said act at (\$212.45 ) Mar 2nd, 1907; and,

WHEREAS, I. Fixing Davis, have selected said land in allotment for myself, and by such action declare my intention of purchasing the improvements thereon at the aforesaid price, and acquiescence in the operation of said Act of March 2, 1907:

I do hereby acknowledge that a lien is by virtue of said Act visited on the rents and profits of said land, which lien shall be enforceable in any court of competent jurisdiction out of the rents and profits issuing from said land, conditioned that said sum of \$212.45 remains unpaid.

## GUARDIAN'S DEED.

THIS INDENTURE, Made the 5th day of October, nineteen hundred and eight, at Claremore, Rogers County, State of Oklahoma, by and between D. N. Leerskov, the duly appointed, qualified and acting guardian of Belle Caudrey and Emma Caudrey, minors of Tahlequah, Oklahoma, party of the first part, and B. L. Hart, the party of the second part:

WITNESSETH: That Whereas, on the 21st, day of August, 1908, the County Court within and for the County of Rogers, State of Oklahoma, made an Order of Sale, authorizing the said party of the first part to sell certain real estate of the said Belle Caudrey and Emma Caudrey, situated in the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, described in said order of sale.

And WHEREAS, under and by virtue of said Order of Sale, and pursuant to legal notices given thereof, the said party of the first part, on the 15th, day of September, A. D. Nineteen Hundred and Eight, sold the hereinafter described real estate specified and described in said Order of Sale, subject to confirmation by said Court, for the sum of One Hundred Sixty Dollars, to B. L. Hart, he being the highest and best bidder and that being the highest and best sum bid.

And whereas, the said County Court, upon the due and legal return of his proceedings
