To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

Singleton and Bessie Singleton, for their heirs, executors or administrators, do _____ hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party _____ of the second part, that at the delivery of these presents they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unincumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever; Second party agrees to assume all general taxes subsequent to the year 1918 and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party _____ of the second part, his heirs and assigns, against said parties _____ of the first part, their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
