WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Three Thousand and _____ Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do _____ by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, their heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa, and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The north half (1/2) of Lot Three (Lot 3) in Block One hundred and forty six (146) in the original townsite of Tulsa, Oklahoma, according to the recorded plat thereof.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said J. E. Peirson and Ellen L. Peirson for their heirs, executors or administrators, do _____ hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that at the delivery of these presents they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unincumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever; excepting paving tax.

and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part, her heirs and assigns, against said parties of the first part, their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
