and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Two (5) Block Two (2) in Lindsay's first Addition to the City of Tulsa Indian
Territory according to the Plat on file

To have and to hold the same unto the said W. F. Ewing and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

~~And hereby covenant~~ with said W. F. Ewing that I
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all ~~claims~~ whomever persons claiming the same by and through me

And I, Mary C. Alexander wife of the said C. P. Alexander
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said W. F. Ewing
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
