Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Thomas Wiswall and Aileen Wiswall
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Eight Hundred and 00/100 DOLLARS,
in hand paid by Thomas E. Shaw, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged

do hereby bargain, grant, ^{bargain} sell and convey unto the said Thomas E. Shaw
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Beginning at a point 484 feet South of the quarter section corner between sections 11 and 12 in Township 19 North, Range 12 East, Creek Nation, Indian Territory, and running thence West 72.2 feet to the left bank of the Arkansas River, thence South easterly along said bank 262 feet, thence East 560 feet to the section line between sections 11 and 12, said Township and Range, thence North along said section line 206 feet to the place of beginning containing 3.02 acres more or less, and being a part of Lot 2 in Section 11, Township 19 North, Range 12 East,

To have and to hold the same unto the said Thomas E. Shaw and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Thomas E. Shaw that we will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Aileen Wiswall wife of the said Thomas Wiswall for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Thomas E. Shaw all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
