Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we William M. Kewel and Lelia D. Kewel
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Sixteen Hundred (\$1,600.) DOLLARS,
to us in hand paid, by A. B. Norton, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby ~~buy~~ ^{buy} grant, sell and convey unto the said A. B. Norton
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Town of Tulsa,
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The South twenty five (25) feet of lot One (1), and the North fifty (50) feet of lot two (2)
Block One hundred eighty one (181), being a flat of ground of the uniform width of twenty five (25)
feet, and One hundred and forty (140) feet deep, according to the government plat of the
fore said town.

To have and to hold the same unto the said A. B. Norton and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said A. B. Norton that we
will forever warrant and defend the title to said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Lelia D. Kewel wife of the said William M. Kewel
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said A. B. Norton
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
