WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Chauncey A. Owen and Mary Owen
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand Two Hundred DOLLARS,
to them in hand paid by H. S. Corliss and T. W. Buel, the receipt whereof is hereby conferred and
acknowledged,

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{convey} grant, sell and convey unto the said H. S. Corliss and T. W. Buel
and unto their heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Town of Tulsa
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lots numbered Four (4) and Five (5) in Block numbered Sixty (60) in Tulsa, I. T.,
according to the official plat thereof, except the improvements thereon, which are to be removed
by said Chauncey A. Owen.

To have and to hold the same unto the said H. S. Corliss and T. W. Buel and unto their heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said H. S. Corliss and T. W. Buel that they
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Mary Owen wife of the said Chauncey A. Owen
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said H. S. Corliss and T. W. Buel
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
