Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Henry W. Wood and Lora Wood
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) DOLLARS,
Cash in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby bargain, grant, sell and convey unto the said The Kisco Oil & Gas Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Texas and unto its heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot Four (4) in Block Thirty-six (36) in the City of Tulsa, Indian Territory, according to the official map of said City.

To have and to hold the same unto the said The Kisco Oil & Gas Company and unto its heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said The Kisco Oil & Gas Company that we will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Lora Wood wife of the said Henry W. Wood for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said The Kisco Oil & Gas Company all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
