WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That I Adelta K. Berry a single woman of Tulsa, Indian Territory
 for and in consideration of the sum of Six Hundred (\$600.00) DOLLARS,
Cash to me in hand paid the receipt of which I hereby acknowledge

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{relinquish}, grant, sell and convey unto the said Nancy J. Estes
 and unto her heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the
 Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lots 1, 2, 3, and 4 in Block 17 in the Berry Addition to the City of Tulsa.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Nancy J. Estes and unto her heirs
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Nancy J. Estes that she
 will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Adelta K. Berry wife of the said Adelta K. Berry
 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
 all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
