Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we, Susanah Keely and Wesley Keely
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred DOLLARS,
and other valuable consideration

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{convey} grant, sell and convey unto the said E. Reynolds
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The North East quarter of the North West quarter of Sec. 27, T-17 N. Range 14 E. and the E. half
of East half of North West quarter of North West quarter of Section 27, T-17 N. R-14 E. Containing
50 acres more or less and
South West quarter of South East quarter of Sec. 27, T-17 N. Range 14 E. Containing 40 acres
more or less

To have and to hold the same unto the said E. Reynolds and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And we hereby covenant with said E. Reynolds and his heirs and assigns that we
will forever warrant and defend the title to said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Susanah Keely wife of the said Wesley Keely
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said E. Reynolds
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
