Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Alvin J. Hodge and Mary J. Hodge
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of one DOLLARS,

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{relinquish} grant, sell and convey unto the said J. M. Hall and J. M. Gillette
and unto their heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The South west (SW) of Northeast Quarter (NE) and Lots seven (7) and eight (8) in Section Six (6)
Township nineteen (19) North Range Thirteen (13)

To have and to hold the same unto the said J. M. Hall and J. M. Gillette and unto their heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said J. M. Hall and J. M. Gillette that we
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

This deed is given in correction of former deed dated July 10, 1904.

And I, Mary J. Hodge wife of the said Alvin J. Hodge
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. M. Hall and J. M. Gillette
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
