To have and to hold the same unto the said C. D. Smith and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said C. D. Smith that we
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Etta M. De Vinna wife of the said Maurice A. De Vinna
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said C. D. Smith
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
