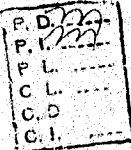

Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Benjamin F. Colley and Mary E. Colley
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred DOLLARS,
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{convey} grant, sell and convey unto the said T. E. Smiley
 and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Town of Red Fork
 Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

An undivided one half interest in and to lots number five (5) and six (6) block number
forty three (43) according to official & approved plat of the town of Red Fork I. T.

To have and to hold the same unto the said T. E. Smiley and unto his heirs
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said T. E. Smiley that we
 will forever warrant and defend the title to said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Mary E. Colley wife of the said Benjamin F. Colley
 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said T. E. Smiley
 all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
