and unto Her heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Green Nation
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot Number Three (3) in Block Number Twenty Eight (28) of the Town of Tulsa
According to the government plat and survey thereof

To have and to hold the same unto the said Mary Green Kisk and unto Her heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Mary Green Kisk that I
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, the wife of the said

all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
