Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Maurice A. De Vinna and Etta M. De Vinna
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred and Twenty DOLLARS,
In them cash in hand paid by Jennie Green the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged
and confirmed

do hereby ~~bargain~~ ^{bargain} grant, sell and convey unto the said Jennie Green
and unto her heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Cherokee Nation
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Number (10) in Block Number (1) One in Brady Heights, and addition to
the City of Tulsa Indian Territory according to the Plat thereof

To have and to hold the same unto the said Jennie Green and unto her heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant \$ with said Jennie Green that they
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Etta M. De Vinna wife of the said Maurice A. De Vinna
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Jennie Green
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
