Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we J. D. Harlow and Alabama Harlow
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand DOLLARS,

do hereby ~~bargain~~ ^{warrant} grant, sell and convey unto the said John M. Ingram
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lots 5, 7, and 8, in Block 7, in the incorporated town of Oklawaha, D. T., according to the U.S. Government survey thereof.

To have and to hold the same unto the said John M. Ingram and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said John M. Ingram that I
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Alabama Harlow wife of the said J. D. Harlow
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said John M. Ingram
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
