Beginning at a point four hundred twenty (420) feet west of the southeast corner of the
North east Quarter (N.E. 1/4) of the Northwest Quarter (N.W. 1/4) of Section seven (7) Twp. 13 N. R. 13 E.
Range thirteen (13) East, thence west ninety four (94) feet, thence north two hundred ten (210) feet, thence
east ninety four (94) feet thence south to point of beginning, containing about one-half (1/2) acre.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Lola Hunt and unto her heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Lola Hunt that we
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.
