## Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

## Know All Men By These Presents:

That we George W. Adams and Minnie E. Adams  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Five Thousand and no/100 DOLLARS,  
in hand paid by Edward McCoy, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby ~~grant~~ <sup>convey</sup>, grant, sell and convey unto the said Edward McCoy  
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the  
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The East Half (E 1/2) of the South East quarter (SE 1/4) of Section Five (5) in Township Nineteen (19) North Range Thirteen (13) East. Subject to a mortgage of Ten hundred and thirty dollars payable to Nora Burgess Scott.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Edward McCoy and unto his heirs  
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Edward McCoy that we  
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

Subject to my lease now upon said land  
And I, Minnie E. Adams wife of the said George W. Adams  
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Edward McCoy  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
