WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we I, G. W. Blakely (a single man)
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of sixty eight hundred 200/100 DOLLARS,
 in hand paid by John W. Mitchell, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{convey} grant, sell and convey unto the said John W. Mitchell,
 and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation,
 Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot No. Four (4) in Block No. One hundred seven (107) of the town of Tulsa, D.T., according
to the official plat and survey thereof

To have and to hold the same unto the said John W. Mitchell and unto his heirs
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said John W. Mitchell that I
 will forever warrant and defend the title to said lands against all claims whatever,
except taxes for 1906

And I, wife of the said
 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
 all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
