WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Edward M. Wynne and Lucy Wynne
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) DOLLARS,
Cash in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged.

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{reassign}, sell and convey unto the said The Kisco Oil & Gas Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws in force in the Indian Territory.
and unto its ^{successors, legal representatives} heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot 10 (10) in Block Sixty-five (65) in the City of Tulsa, Indian Territory according to the official map of said City.

To have and to hold the same unto the said The Kisco Oil & Gas Company and unto its heirs ^{successors, legal representatives} and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said The Kisco Oil & Gas Company that we will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Lucy Wynne wife of the said Edward M. Wynne
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said The Kisco Oil & Gas Company
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
