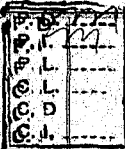

## Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

## Know All Men By These Presents:

That we J. M. Gillette, a single man, J. M. Hall and Jennie S. Hall  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Two thousand DOLLARS,  
to us in hand paid by J. W. Hocheb, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby bargain, grant, <sup>convey</sup> sell and convey unto the said J. W. Hocheb  
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Levee nation  
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

all of an undivided one third interest in and to Blocks Numbered Nine (9), Twelve (12), Fifteen (15)  
and eighteen (18) in the Gillette and Hall Addition to the City of Tulsa, Creek Nation, Indian Territory.

To have and to hold the same unto the said J. W. Hocheb and unto his heirs  
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said J. W. Hocheb that We  
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever, subject to an oil and Gas lease made to Grant E.  
Stebbins and his assigns.

And I, Jennie S. Hall wife of the said J. M. Hall  
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. W. Hocheb  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
