WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

## Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Lora E. Hull and George I. Hull ~~and~~ her husband  
~~for~~ for and in consideration of the sum of Thirteen Hundred DOLLARS,  
Cash in hand paid by McKendree L. Cole, the purchaser

do hereby ~~grant~~ <sup>relinquish</sup> grant, sell and convey unto McKendree L. Cole  
 and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Town of Tulsa  
 Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Number Four (4) containing a frontage on Lansing Avenue of seventy four and  
one third feet (74 1/3) and one hundred and fifty feet deep (150) in Block Number Thirteen (13),  
in the Hodge Addition to Tulsa, Indian Territory, according to the town plat and survey thereof.

To have and to hold the same unto the said McKendree L. Cole and unto his heirs  
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant S with said McKendree L. Cole that they  
 will forever warrant and defend the title <sup>to</sup> of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I ~~wife of the said~~ wife of the said George I. Hull  
 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said  
 all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
