Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Clifton George and Mary W. George
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Three Thousand DOLLARS,
in hand paid by the Shiocton Bank, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby ^{begin} ~~begin~~, grant, sell and convey unto the said The Shiocton Bank
and unto its heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The north fifty (50) feet, allowing for the variation of the traverse from the true meridian of lot
numbered two (2) in Block numbered eighty-six (86) in the town of Shiocton, Indian Territory, according to
the official plat thereof.

To have and to hold the same unto the said The Shiocton Bank and unto its heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said The Shiocton Bank that we
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Mary W. George wife of the said Clifton George
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said The Shiocton Bank
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
