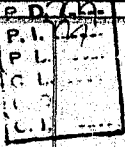

Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we John S. Kallam and Sophia Kallam
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Three Thousand \$ DOLLARS,
in hand paid by Clifton George, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby ^{voluntarily} ~~begin~~ grant, sell and convey unto the said Clifton George
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The north fifty (50) feet, allowing for the variation of the townsite from the true meridian
of lot numbered two (2) in Block numbered eighty-six (86) in the town of Tulsa, Indian Territory,
according to the official plat thereof.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Clifton George and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Clifton George that We
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Sophia Kallam wife of the said John S. Kallam
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Clifton George
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
