WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Warrior A. Rentie and Aurella K. Rentie
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars and other valuable **DOLLARS,**
considerations to us in hand this day pay by C. J. Wightman, James B. Diggs and Adrian S. Houck
this receipt of which is hereby acknowledged both this day granted, bargained, sold and conveyed and
by these presents

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{bargain} grant, sell and convey unto the said C. J. Wightman, James B. Diggs and Adrian S. Houck
and unto their heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Green Nation

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

An undivided one half (1/2) interest in and to the west half of the northwest quarter (NW 1/2 NW 1/4)
of Section Two (2), of Township Seventeen (17) North of Range Twelve (12) East of the Indian Meridian.

To have and to hold the same unto the said C. J. Wightman, James B. Diggs and Adrian S. Houck and unto their heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said C. J. Wightman, James B. Diggs and Adrian S. Houck that we
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Aurella K. Rentie wife of the said Warrior A. Rentie
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said C. J. Wightman, James B. Diggs and Adrian S. Houck
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
