Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Henry Morrison and Sallie Morrison
 his wife ^{by Sub. Test.} for and in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand (\$2,000) DOLLARS,
 to us in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{reassign} grant, sell and convey unto the said A. K. Blackburn of Tulsa, Indian Territory
 and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the
 Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The North-east Quarter (N.E. 1/4) of Section Thirty-four (34), Township Eighteen (18) North, Range Thirteen (13) East of the Indian Base and Meridian, being the lands allotted to Ananias R. Morrison, our child, who died without issue December 10, 1899, and of whom we are the sole heirs.

To have and to hold the same unto the said A. K. Blackburn and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said A. K. Blackburn that we will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all ~~claims whatever~~ ^{persons claiming by, through, or under us}.

And I, Sallie Morrison wife of the said Henry Morrison for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said A. K. Blackburn all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
