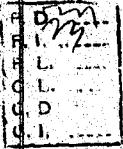

Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we W. L. Hissong and Annie Hissong
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Eleven Hundred forty (\$1140.00) DOLLARS,

do hereby ^{bargain} grant, sell and convey unto the said W. L. Butten
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the
^{Subsidiary} Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

the south fifty (50) feet of lot number two (2), in block number three (3), in the Burnett addition to the City of Tulsa, Ind. Ter., as shown by the original plat of said addition now on file in the office of the United States Court, at Sapulpa, Ind. Ter.

To have and to hold the same unto the said W. L. Butten and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said W. L. Butten that they will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Annie Hissong wife of the said A. L. Hissong
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said W. L. Butten
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
