WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Mary J. Hodge and Alvin I. Hodge her husband
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar (\$1.00) DOLLARS,

do hereby ~~bargain~~ ^{convey} grant, sell and convey unto the said J. M. Hall and J. M. Gillette
 and unto their heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Leech Nation

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

South one half (1/2) of the south west quarter (1/4) and the northeast quarter (1/4) of the southwest quarter (1/4) of section five (5), Township nineteen (19) north, range thirteen (13) east.

This deed is made in correction of a deed of May 16, 1906, between same parties.

To have and to hold the same unto the said J. M. Hall and J. M. Gillette and unto their heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said J. M. Hall and J. M. Gillette that we will forever warrant and defend the title ^{To} said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Alvin I. Hodge husband ~~me~~ of the said Mary J. Hodge for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. M. Hall and J. M. Gillette all my rights of ~~dower and homestead~~ ^{Curtsey} in and to the said lands.
