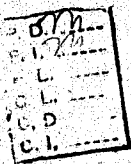

Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know All Men By These Presents:

That we John W. Mitchell and Alice M. Mitchell
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty and no/100 DOLLARS,
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{convey} sell and convey unto the said James A. Harris
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Town of West Tulsa, Creek Nation,
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot Numbered five (5), Block numbered fifteen (15) situated in the Town of West Tulsa, Creek Nation, Indian Territory, according to the recorded plat thereof.

To have and to hold the same unto the said James A. Harris and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

I contract and bind myself
And hereby covenant with said James A. Harris that we
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims ~~whatsoever~~ persons claiming the same by and through us.

And I, Alice M. Mitchell wife of the said John W. Mitchell
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said James A. Harris
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
