Know All Men By These Presents:

That we R. S. Waddell and Ora Waddell
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Six Hundred (\$600.00) DOLLARS,
in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged and confessed.

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{bargain}, grant, sell and convey unto C. B. Campbell
 and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa,
 Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Three (3) in Block Two (5) of the Grandview Addition to the City of Tulsa,
Indian Territory, according to the plat thereof on file in the Recorder's office of this district.

To have and to hold the same unto the said C. B. Campbell and unto his heirs
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said C. B. Campbell that they
 will forever warrant and defend the title ^{to} said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Ora Waddell wife of the said R. S. Waddell
 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said C. B. Campbell
 all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
