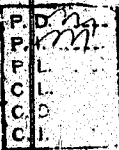

## Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

## Know All Men By These Presents:

That we L. C. Wells (singleman) Ralsas F. Morley and Augusta M. Morley,  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Nine hundred & 00/100 DOLLARS,  
in hand paid by G. L. Holt, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby ~~grant~~ <sup>convey</sup> grant, sell and convey unto the said G. L. Holt,  
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation,  
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot No. Nine (9) in Block No. Three (3) in the Lindsay's First Addition to the town of  
Tulsa, I.T., according to the recorded plat and survey thereof.

To have and to hold the same unto the said G. L. Holt, and unto his heirs  
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said G. L. Holt, that we  
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Augusta M. Morley, wife of the said Ralsas F. Morley,  
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said G. L. Holt,  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
