WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we John O. Mitchell and Alice M. Mitchell
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of eighty (\$80.00) DOLLARS,
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{convey} and convey unto the said J. E. Priester, Red Fork, Indian Ter.
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

lots one (1), and two (2), Block eight (8) in West Tulsa, Indian Territory

To have and to hold the same unto the said J. E. Priester and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said J. E. Priester that they
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Alice M. Mitchell wife of the said John O. Mitchell
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. E. Priester
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
