will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Texana Woolley wife of the said James Woolley  
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. W. Haigler  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
