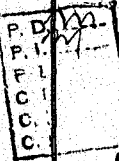

Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Alfred R. Baber and Laura E. Baber
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One (\$1.00) DOLLARS,
cash in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{buy} grant, sell and convey unto the said The Tusco Oil & Gas Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under
the laws in force in the Indian Territory of legal representation
and unto its heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot Three (3) in Block sixty six (66) in the City of Tulsa, Indian Territory,
According to the official map of said city

To have and to hold the same unto the said The Tusco Oil & Gas Company and unto its ^{successors} heirs
^{legal representatives}
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said The Tusco Oil & Gas Company that we
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Laura E. Baber wife of the said Alfred R. Baber
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said The Tusco Oil & Gas Company
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
