Know All Men By These Presents:

That we George W. Adams and Minnie E. Adams
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One DOLLAR,
and other valuable considerations, in hand paid by R. S. Wadell, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby ~~buy~~ ^{convey}, grant, sell and convey unto the said R. S. Wadell
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The South West quarter of the North East quarter of the North West quarter (SW⁴ NE⁴ NW⁴) in Section
24, Township 20, North, Range 12 East, containing 16 acres, more or less.

To have and to hold the same unto the said R. S. Wadell and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said R. S. Wadell that he
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Minnie E. Adams wife of the said George W. Adams
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said R. S. Wadell
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
