

## Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

## Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Laura M. Harrison and William Harrison her husband  
 wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty (\$150.00) DOLLARS,  
 in hand paid by Arthur C. Meier, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby ~~grant~~ <sup>convey</sup>, grant, sell and convey unto the said Arthur C. Meier  
 and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the  
 Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot 5 in Block 5, in the Bellview Addition to the Town of Tulsa,  
Western District, Indian Territory.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Arthur C. Meier and unto his heirs  
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Arthur C. Meier that we  
 will forever warrant and defend the title <sup>to</sup> said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, William Harrison husband ~~one~~ of the said Laura M. Harrison  
 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Arthur C. Meier  
 all my rights of ~~dower~~ <sup>curety</sup> and homestead in and to the said lands.
