WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we C. E. Burton and Wesley M. Bush, both single,
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty (\$20.00) DOLLARS,
in hand paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby ~~begin~~ ^{renew} grant, sell and convey unto the said Jake Brewington
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Green Nation
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Fifteen (15), Block Seven (7), West Tulsa, Green Nation, Indian Territory,
according to the plat and survey thereof,

To have and to hold the same unto the said Jake Brewington and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Jake Brewington that we
will forever warrant and defend the title ^{to} said lands against all claims whatever.

And we wife of the said Jake Brewington
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Jake Brewington
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
