WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we J. M. Gillette a single man and J. M. Hall and Jennie S. Hall
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty one Hundred DOLLARS,
same in hand paid by Samuel S. Miller the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged.

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{regrant} self and convey unto the said Samuel S. Miller
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Blocks Nos. (10) and Eleven (11) in the Gillette & Hall addition to the city of Tulsa Creek
Nation Indian Territory as per plat on file in the office of the United States Clerk and Recorder at Tulsa, I.T.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Samuel S. Miller and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Samuel S. Miller that We
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Jennie S. Hall wife of the said J. M. Hall
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Samuel S. Miller
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
