Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we, Mary Kelly or Mary Warley and Warley husband
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of (2000.00) Two Thousand DOLLARS,

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{convey} grant, sell and convey unto the said Edward Crowell and Legue C. Perryman
 and unto their heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot 6, the West 1/2 of SW 1/4 Sec. 9 Township 19th Range 12^E and Lot 7, the E 1/2 of SE 1/4 Sec. 8,
Township 19th Range 12^E except the Homestead and the Right of Way of a V. W. R. Road containing
80 acres more or less. Allotment of Mary Kelly, minor daughter of said Mary Warley.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Edward Crowell & Legue C. Perryman and unto their heirs
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Edward Crowell & Legue C. Perryman that they
 will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all persons claiming by, through, or under us.

And I, Warley husband wife of the said Mary Warley
 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Crowell & Perryman
 all my rights of equity and homestead in and to the said lands.
