Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Ellen Gillis and Charley Gillis, her husband
 for and in consideration of the sum of Sixteen Hundred (\$1600) DOLLARS,
 to them in hand paid by Frank A. Haver, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby ~~bargain~~ ^{bargain}, grant, sell and convey unto the said Frank A. Haver,
 and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Leek Nation
 Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot number Four (4), in Block number Ninety-nine (99), in the city of Tulsa, Indian
Territory, according to the United States Government survey and plat thereof.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Frank A. Haver and unto his heirs
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Frank A. Haver that they
 will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Charley Gillis ~~husband~~ ^{husband} of the said Ellen Gillis
 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Frank A. Haver
 all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
