WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

## Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Ernest H. Williamson and Alameda Williamson  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One (\$1.00) DOLLARS,  
Cash in hand paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby <sup>bargein</sup> bargain, grant, sell and convey unto the said The Tisco Oil & Gas Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under  
<sup>the laws of the Indian Territory</sup> the laws of the Indian Territory, and unto its heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the  Creek Nation

Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot Five (5) in Block Thirty-five (35) in the City of Tulsa, Indian Territory according to the  
official map of said City.

To have and to hold the same unto the said The Tisco Oil & Gas Company and unto its heirs,  
<sup>successors, legal representatives</sup> and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said The Tisco Oil & Gas Company that we  
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Alameda Williamson wife of the said Ernest H. Williamson  
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said The Tisco Oil & Gas Company  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
