WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we A Gould and Mattie Gould
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of \$280.00 DOLLARS,

The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{release}, grant, sell and convey unto the said A. A. Bowen
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the town of Tulsa, S.E. Creek Nation
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All my undivided one half (1/2) interest in and to the Northern one half (1/2) of Lot number five (5) in block one hundred and twenty four (124) according to the original survey of the City of Tulsa Indian Territory.

To have and to hold the same unto the said A. A. Bowen and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said A. A. Bowen that they will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Mattie Gould wife of the said A. Gould
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said A. A. Bowen
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
