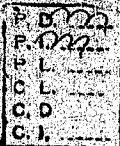

## Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

## Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Alvin I. Hodge and Mary J. Hodge  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One DOLLARS,  
to us in hand paid by Thomas E. Smiley

do hereby ~~grant~~ <sup>convey</sup> grant, sell and convey unto the said Thomas E. Smiley  
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek nation  
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lots one (1) two (2) three (3) four (4) five (5) six (6) seven (7) eight (8) nine (9) ten (10) eleven (11) twelve (12) thirteen (13) fourteen (14) fifteen (15) and sixteen (16) in Block Five (5) in the Hodge addition to the town of Tulsa, Ind. Ter.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Thomas E. Smiley and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Thomas E. Smiley that we will forever warrant and defend the title <sup>to</sup> said lands against all claims whatever.

This deed is in correction of deed to same lots, dated March 1, 1904, to same grantee.  
And I, Mary J. Hodge wife of the said Alvin I. Hodge  
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Thomas E. Smiley  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
