WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Lucy A. Bigley and Frank Bigley her husband
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred seventeen and 50/100 DOLLARS,
 to them paid cash in hand, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, to them paid by Bettie L. Brintnall

do hereby ~~grant~~ ^{convey} grant, sell and convey unto the said Bettie L. Brintnall
 and unto her heirs and assigns forever, the following ^{described} lands lying in the Cherokee Nation
 Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lots number five (5) and six (6) block number one (1) in the town of Skiatook Indian Territory,
according to the original recorded plat thereof.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Bettie L. Brintnall and unto her heirs
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Bettie L. Brintnall that they
 will forever warrant and defend the title ^{to} said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Frank Bigley Husband ~~one~~ of the said Lucy A. Bigley
 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Bettie L. Brintnall
 all my rights of ^{convey} dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
